IBE Executive Committee meets in Glasgow

Dear Friends

I am happy to write to you again to report the latest activities in the IBE. To run an organisation requires, as you all know, the regular chance to meet and to discuss current as well as planned activities - apart from all the formal issues that need to be addressed. Due to the expense involved, the possibility for the IBE Executive Committee to

> meet is limited to one annual meeting, when we also meet jointly with the ILAE Executive Committee. We also find the opportunity to meet at

the time of International Epilepsy Congresses. Due to generous sponsorship the IBE Executive Committee was able to gather in Glasgow in mid November for some intense

days of discussion on a range of important issues. The meeting was called to discuss the immediate future of IBE and to focus on which priorities should be addressed during the remaining period of office. We also took the opportunity to focus on our Long Term Strategy and to review its contents in line with discussion and decisions taken.

One issue that was discussed in great detail was the issue of finance and the urgent need for IBE to formulate a fundraising strategy for the coming years. The continued development of the regions was also in focus as well as the importance of the visibility of IBE to the outside world. We also looked at IBE enlargement with emphasis on the current 'blank spots' where IBE is not presently represented. As a result of this discussion, it was agreed to launch a Membership Drive 2008 in order to strengthen IBE expansion
