




CALL FOR LETTERS OF INTENT



Improving the quality of life for persons with epilepsy worldwide!





THE STORY SO FAR

- Providing goat rearing and vegetable growing training;
- Developing tailoring skills to help people become selfsufficient;
- Creating programs to raise awareness about epilepsy in people with epilepsy, in teachers and pupils, and in the community in general;
- Developing a Drugs Bank Project to provide affordable medication;
- Setting up a peanut butter project;
- Introducing appropriate driving legislation for people with epilepsy;
- Producing animated **films and documentary videos** to teach children and adults about epilepsy.

These are just some of the **50 initiatives** created by members in emerging nations in the past five years, thanks to funding through the Promising Strategy Program. Each project has received between **US\$1,000** and **US\$5,000** in support.

Continuing from the decision taken in 2010, support will be provided to projects in each of IBE's seven regions — provided appropriate applications are received.

So there has never been a better time to get involved!





HOW TO APPLY

To have your project considered, all you need do at this time is to submit a short Letter of Intent, no more than one page in length, giving a brief outline of the proposed project.

The letter must be received at the IBE office no later than Monday 21st November 2011.

GUIDELINES

Your association should be located in a country where the gross national income (GNI) is less than US\$10,000 according to World Bank figures. Exceptions may be considered.

The project must be new; funding will **not** be provided to support an existing program or ongoing work of an association.

The initiative should:

- Be sustainable after the end of the funding period and, ideally, be a program that could be copied by members in other countries.
- Have a definite time line and a specific objective.
- Be a program that can make a **real difference** to the lives of people with epilepsy and those who care for them.
