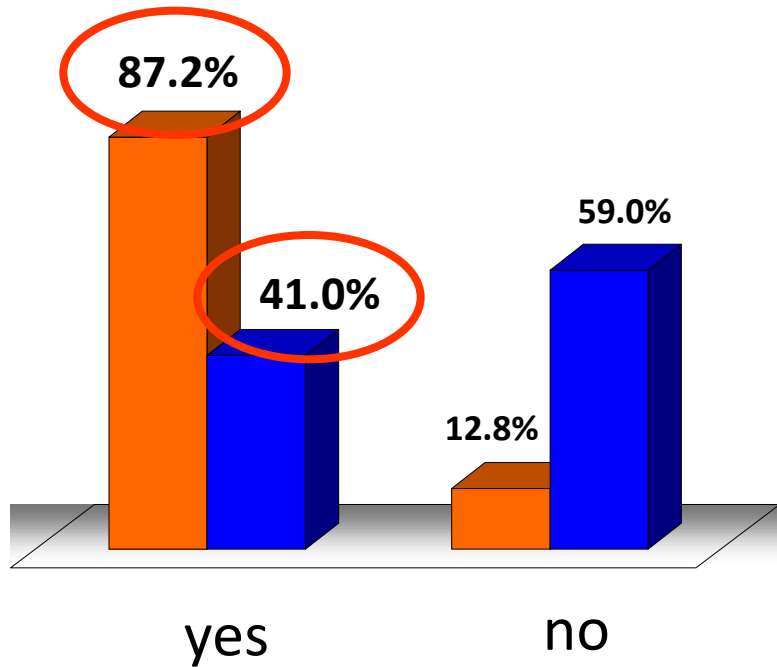


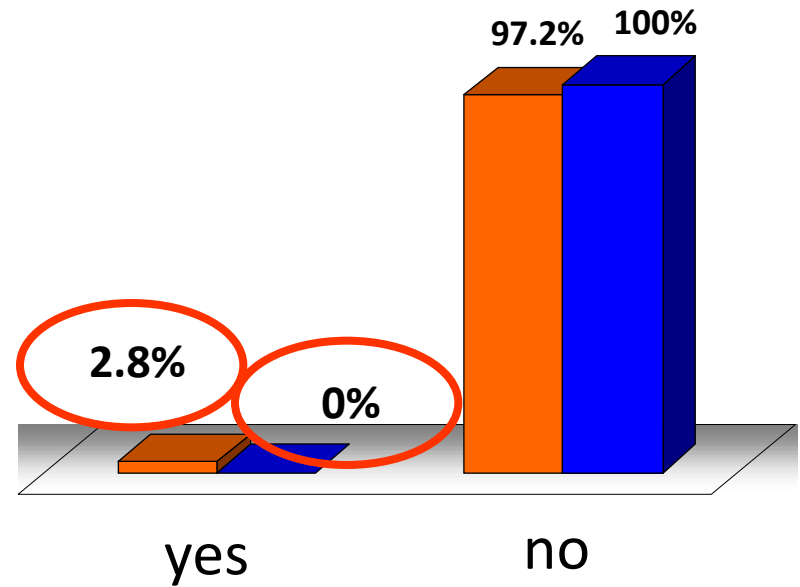

Do you have prejudice against epileptics / people with epilepsy?

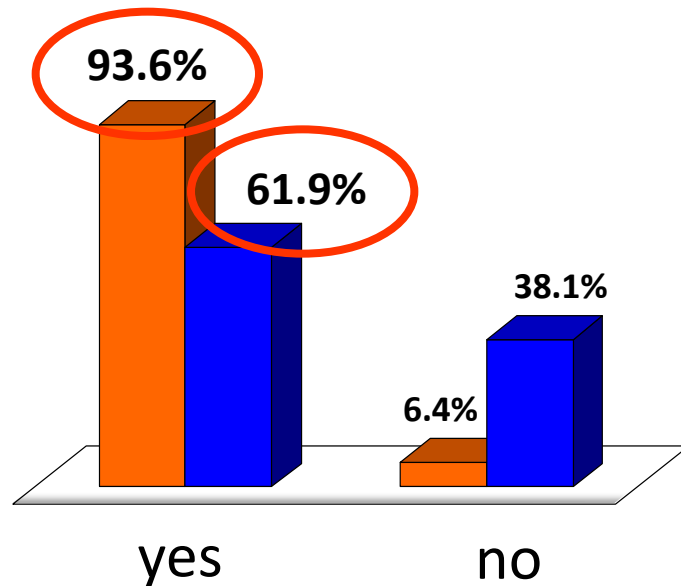

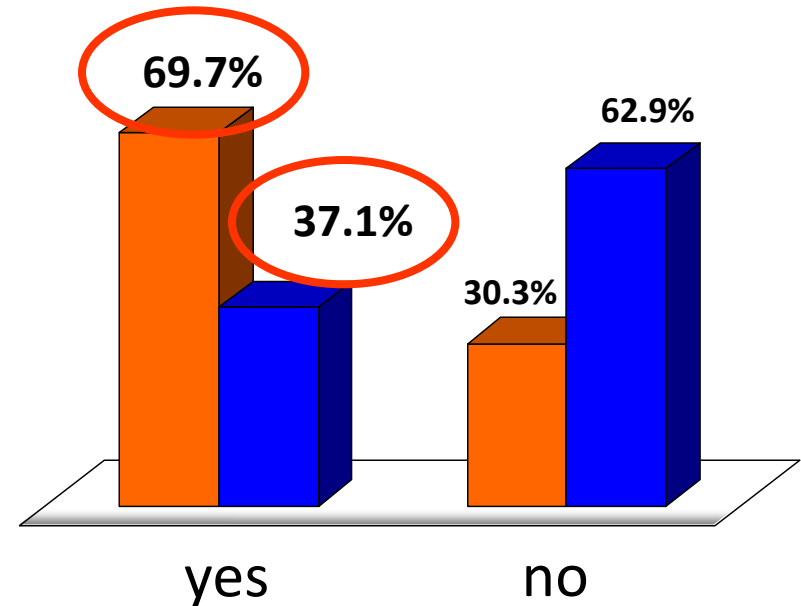
